Club Meeting: Wednesday 13th August 2025

Hartlepool Art Gallery, Christ Church, Church Square, Hartlepool, 7.00pm – 9.00pm (doors open 6.40pm)

We are lucky this month to have fellow member **Ted Parker** as our demonstrator. Ted will show how to prepare and paint in oils on canvas, and how the painting develops in its stages to the finished article, using pre prepared examples of the same subject/ composition.

This will be based around painting a railway scene, avoiding the pitfalls of not having 'Railway Knowledge' and hopefully ending up with a factually correct picture. As Ted says, there are no hard & fast rules but he hopes to pass on what he has learned over several decades of painting his beloved steam engines and similar railway related subjects, showing how certain effects are produced using oil paint on canvas.

Born in Sheffield 1949, Ted won the school Art Prize 2 years running, but left school at the age of 15 with no qualifications! He started a career as an Industrial Scientific Photographer for British Steel Research in 1969 and moved to Teesside in 1977. It was around the early 1970s he began to do slightly more serious painting completing several commissions of sailing yachts and racing dinghies.

His first successful railway painting was in 1975 when he won a competition on Yorkshire Television of a scene in York Locomotive shed.

He joined the Guild of Railway Artists in 1978 for the first time and finally achieved getting a painting selected for 'Rail Art 1980' at the York NRM. Due to pressure of work he found little time to paint until, in 2007, he had a filming assignment working with the renowned railway and wildlife artist, the late and magnificent David Shepherd, who gave Ted a verbal kicking to get back to painting again!! Ted was very grateful to be so eloquently reprimanded for letting his skills lapse.

As a result, Ted's first solo exhibition was held at The Station at Richmond in 2018. His recent collaboration with Malcolm Davies and John Wigston in staging the 'Art of Locomotion' exhibition at the NRM 'Locomotion' in Shildon, was another great success.
